Why are clinical research studies conducted with healthy subjects?

- In general, a "healthy participant" is defined as someone not currently taking medications and meet the study's medical safety guidelines.
- Doctors are able to learn what "normal" looks like to understand the impact of the medication being developed.
- Doctors can learn whether the medication will be safe to give patients.
- Doctors begin by giving a very small dosage of the medication to the participants to measure how the medicine is absorbed, metabolized, and utilized.
